Stephen Ministry

You Are Invited to Participate in the Stephen Ministry at First Parish

A number of members are organizing a Stephen Ministry at First Parish. The Stephen Ministry—named for Stephen, who in Acts 6 was appointed to assist members of the community suffering acute hardships—is a 50-year-old interdenominational Christian tradition. The service trains lay members of the congregation in psychology and theology to be a Christian presence with any in the community suffering acute challenges. Typical examples would include bereavement, divorce, terminal illness, substance abuse, or mental illness. Fully details of the program are here: Stephen Ministries

A Stephen Minister's objective is not to "solve" the challenge but rather to ensure that none feel alone in their struggles. (Jesus, after all, did not come to "fix" all of our challenges, but rather to be *with* us in our struggles.) At the same time, the Stephen Ministry in a congregation develops a network of specialized services suitable to assist individuals with particular problems. For example, someone struggling with alcoholism would be introduced to a local AA group, while the Stephen Minister would continue to meet with that individual as a friend and witness.

The team is currently working closely with the Outreach & Service Committee and the Care Team on this project. Two of us are planning to participate in the 25-hour live training program for team leaders offered by the Stephen Ministry headquarters. In the short term, as the leadership is trained and the program develops, our intention is to augment the work of the Care Team and develop our network of local services to which we can refer people for specialized support. Our tentative expectation is that during the current program year we will assist people within the congregation, with the goal of offering a fully trained and developed service to the broader local community in the following program year.

Currently the group meets virtually at 5 pm the first and third Tuesdays of each month to develop the program. In person training and social events will follow! There are many ways to participate depending upon your gifts and availability, so if you think you might be interested, please feel free to just attend and listen.

First Annual Messiah Sing—a great success!

The cooler weather along with a dusting of snow arrived just in time to add to the holiday season atmosphere of the "Messiah Sing" presented at the Church on Sunday evening, December 11th. This "Sing" was dedicated to the memory of Laura Ells, who was for many years a member of the First Parish Choir and whose bequest helped make the evening possible. As Music Director, Dr. Herman Weiss described it, "The whole idea is that people who may or may not know each other will spontaneously get together with professionals to create something beautiful." And we did! The event was widely advertised and open to anyone who wanted to sing or listen. The Deacons counted 136 people in the Sanctuary and some of them drove two hours through the snow to sing with us. Herman had been planning this event for many months, indeed since last year when we had to postpone it due to the surging pandemic. This was the 8th such Messiah Sing that he has directed. The format of the evening had the singing audience, including the First Parish Church Choir, seated in four sections with visitors who were provided with scores if they didn't bring their own – which many did. We sang the choruses for Part I of the Messiah plus the beloved Hallelujah Chorus, and the arias and recitatives were song by four profoundly professional soloists: Holly Cameron, soprano; Rebecca Shrimpton, mezzosoprano; Robert Cinnante, tenor; and Paul Knox, baritone. Such magnificent voices! We were accompanied by a professional orchestra of nine members of the Cape Ann Symphony and a harpsichordist, Robert Littlefield of Beverly.

Christiane Alsop wrote a heartfelt message to the Choir that encouraged us to do it again and captured exactly the response we had hope to elicit. "The Messiah-Sing-Along will forever be engraved in my memory as such a moving, and yes, glorious moment. I loved every minute of it: Herman's inviting, anxiety-melting ways of introducing the event and conducting it, the soloists, the orchestra and then us, the expert choir singers and the commoners (like me), all together joining in the creation of it all - awe-inspiring in the true sense of the word.... Cannot think of a better way to open our Church's doors for all those who usually shy away from entering."

Following the singing, a reception was held in the newly renovated Chapel Hall where there were delicious refreshments and time to mingle with new friends and celebrate an inspiring evening. Having worked up an appetite, nearly half the attendees joined us for charcuterie, sandwiches, donated Prosecco and cookies. Many hands (and voices) went into making this event successful, but the round of applause when Herman walked into the room was most deserved and a testament to the joy of music.
