Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry Working Luncheon Sunday June 4

The Stephen Ministry team has been working hard to develop a robust and practical plan to provide care to members of the community facing challenging life circumstances both within the Congregation and, in the longer term, the broader community. These will be presented and discussed at a luncheon for interested members of the Congregation following the church service on June 4. Following the guidance and experience of the Stephen Ministry movement, we intend to implement the following elements:

- One on one, longer term confidential Christian companionship as requested for members of the Congregation dealing with difficult life situations. This will be guided by the Stephen Ministry tradition that the role of the Stephen Minister is to be with people in their struggles rather than to attempt to solve the care receiver's challenges.
- Shorter term, tangible supportive activities such as meals delivered to the homebound, hospital visits, or the like building on the excellent ongoing work of the Care Team, hopefully with a deeper pool of volunteers.
- Identification of individuals and offices within the Congregation who will look out for situations in which a Stephen Minister might be helpful.
- Engagement of a Community Resource Network, a set of ongoing and carefully
 maintained relationships with area organizations well equipped to provide specific
 types of support to Stephen Ministry care receivers. Examples of this might include the
 Manchester Council on Aging, which provides a variety of services to meet special
 needs of seniors; Lifebridge, providing emergency housing support and many related
 services; Beverly Bootstraps, offering a broad range of social programs; and area 12
 Step programs supporting recovery from addictive behaviors.
- Support for our new minister. In anticipation of the arrival of our new minister, we are aware that whoever she or he might be, that person will need some time to get to know us and may be concerned about how best to provide pastoral care. Part of the Stephen Ministry program is that the minster is an integral part of that process. Our goal is to ensure that our new minister will be able to engage with us in pastoral care as easily and effectively as possible.

• Longer term, equip Stephen Ministers to serve in the broad community outside our Congregation. The full Stephen Minister training prepares us to work with people we don't know and includes elements such as how to deal with instances of abuse or neglect; when to engage mental health professionals; understanding when to engage theological understandings and when not to; and many other challenging situations. We are hopeful that our initial in depth training can be done in conjunction with a nearby well-established Stephen Ministry Program.

Please come to the luncheon to learn more about all these program elements, whether or not you are currently motivated to volunteer. There will be many different opportunities over time to participate, for folks with many different types of commitment or talents. A discarded painting in a junk pile, a skeleton in an attic, and the greatest racehorse in American history: from these strands, a Pulitzer Prize winner braids a sweeping story of spirit, obsession, and injustice across American history. Kentucky, 1850. An enslaved groom named Jarret and a bay foal forge a bond of understanding that will carry the horse to record-setting victories across the South. When the nation erupts in civil war, an itinerant young artist who has made his name on paintings of the racehorse takes up arms for the Union. On a perilous night, he reunites with the stallion and his groom, very far from the glamor of any racetrack. New York City, 1954, Martha Jackson, a gallery owner celebrated for taking risks on edgy contemporary painters, becomes obsessed with a nineteenth-century equestrian oil painting of mysterious provenance. Washington, DC, 2019. Jess, a Smithsonian scientist from Australia, and Theo, a Nigerian-American art historian, find themselves unexpectedly connected through their shared interest in the horse. One studying the stallion's bones for clues to his power and endurance, the other uncovering the lost history of the unsung Black horsemen who were critical to his racing success. Based on the remarkable true story of the record-breaking thoroughbred Lexington, Horse is a novel of art and science, love and obsession, and our unfinished reckoning with racism. goodreads
