## Scripture Reading Matthew 21: 23-32

When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?"

Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things.

Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?'

But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet."

So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

## Words of Institution

On the night Jesus was betrayed, he took bread, lifted it up toward heaven and blessed it and then broke it. He gave it to his disciples and said, "Take, eat. This bread represents my body, my life which was given for you. As often as you break bread together, do this and remember my love for you." Likewise, Jesus took the cup, raised it up and blessed it, then, looking at his beloved disciples and said, "Drink from this, all of you, for this is the new covenant which has been poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins.
