Scripture Reading and Litany Nancy Peterson Genesis 1:1-2:3

One: In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void, and darkness covered the face of the deep, and the spirit of God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, Many: 'Let there be light.'

One: And there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness.

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the first day . One: God, help us to remember that you are the source of life, and are intimately connected with all living things. You bring form out of chaos, and call all things into being. Everything that we have is thanks to you, O God.

One: And God said,

Many: 'Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.'

One: So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky.

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the second day One: The air that we breathe is yours, O God. The waters are yours too. Sustain us with breath, and slake our thirst, that we might build a world where all can breathe free and find refreshment in you.

One: And God said,

Many: 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear. '

One: God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, Many: 'Let the earth produce plants and trees.'

One: And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good .

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the third day One: Praise be to You, O God, for the growth from seed to plant, the greening of the earth; its fruit—both beauty and food!

One: And God said,

Many: 'Let there be lights in the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, to give light to the earth. '

One: And it was so. God made the sun, the moon, and the stars, in order to shine light upon the earth. And God saw that it was good .

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day . One: Architect of the Universe, Your voice continues to call us past the edges of our exploration, beckoning us towards the unknown, the new, the infinite.

One: And God said,

Many: 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.'

One: So God created the sea creatures of every kind, and all the winged birds. God blessed them, saying,

Many: 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth. '

One: And God saw that it was good.

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day

One: Out of space and time you brought forth material substance:

The atom and the molecule and the crystalline form:

Then the first germ of life and the long upward striving of all things: that swim and creep and fly.

One: And God said,

Many: 'Let the earth teem with countless living creatures of every kind.'

One: And it was so. God made the wild animals and the livestock and everything that creeps on the earth. And God saw that it was good. Then God said,

Many: "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over all the animals of the earth...

One: So God created humans in his image, in the image of God he created them; God blessed them, and God said to them,

Many: 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it. See, I have given you every plant upon the face of all the earth; you shall have them for food.

One: God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good.

Many: And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day

One: Thank you God, for generations of life tumbling one after another. Life creeping, swimming, flying, running, below, above, upon, within. All the

world sings, calls, signals, speaks praise to you, whose glory grows in all that breathes!

Faith Formation Opportunities for All Ages

Through study and prayer and service, we aspire to love God "with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength." From the youngest toddlers, to the wisest Elders, we each are called to grow in our faith and understanding. Sunday School and Youth Group begins in September .

- The Grace Center Gift Cards from local grocery markets for perishables like cream, butter, milk.


