I pray you are all feeling refreshed, renewed and well-summered! It's been such a joy to spend the summer with you all. There are so many highlights! Volunteering with a wonderful First Parish Church crew at the Red, White and Blue pancake breakfast. Welcoming the community to our church during the 4th of July Parade. The Music at Masconomo event (where 65 people participated in the Love Thy Neighbor contest, and 45 kids made sticker scenes). And, of course, the Festival by the Sea, which saw over a hundred people come through our doors at both the Fair and the church! I was able to meet lots and lots of community members through all of these events and First Parish really put our best foot forward to help to "share the love and light of God" with the wider community. Thank you so much to each of you for your contributions and participation. These events also gave me the nudge to create some updated church brochures and fliers which you'll see around the church (feel free to share:)

Early Fall has always been one of my favorite seasons. Maybe it's the bookworm in me, but I always loved going back to school. Fresh school supplies, a new lunch box and endless possibilities ahead - what could be more exciting? That's how I'm feeling this year. Fresh school supplies (have you donated to Faith Formation's School Supply Drive? Read on), a new water bottle ("Lord, help me remember to hydrate"), and endless possibilities ahead for our beautiful, vibrant, Spirit-filled faith community.

I am so excited for worship this Fall. We'll be bringing back Family Sundays (all ages worship on the First Sunday of the month), and will take our first steps together along a scriptural trajectory that will begin with a Creation Celebration on Welcome Back Sunday (9/8) and lead into a sermon series about Abraham for the first half of the Fall. We have much to learn from this founder of the faith, and in a season of division (globally, nationally) I am excited for us to explore more about this figure who is recognized as the Father of three of the world's major religions. Also coming up this Fall we'll

celebrate Jazz Sunday (9/29) and World Communion Sunday (10/6).

There's been a lot of great work going on behind the scenes at First Parish this summer. The Faith Formation Committee has been meeting regularly and is excited to lead the congregation in a Soup and Conversation in October to talk more about our evolving vision for Faith Formation at FPC, and get your ideas about upcoming programming. The Deacons are revising the Deacon Handbook, which is generating a lot of great discussion and discernment. Council is starting to look at our church governance structure with an eye to sustainability, effectiveness and beating burn-out. First Parish Church - we are on the move!


#### FPC Stephen Ministers Begin Community Outreach

The Stephen Ministry at First Parish is pleased to report that it is beginning systematic outreach to our community this fall. The group, commissioned last February, has been working closely with Rev. Katherine to assess and meet the immediate needs of our Congregation and close friends. We are now confident that those needs are being met and emerging needs in our immediate community can be handled as well. As was the initial plan, the group will now broadly engage with allied organizations in Manchester and nearby towns.

As we hope the congregation is aware, the Stephen Ministry—named for Stephen, who in Acts 6 was appointed to assist members of the community suffering acute hardships—is a 50-year-old interdenominational Christian tradition. The service trains lay members of the congregation in psychology and theology to be a Christian presence with any in the community suffering acute life challenges such as bereavement, divorce, or terminal illness. under the overall direction of the Minister. To date, the movement includes about 13,000 congregations and has trained 75,000 Stephen Leaders who have in turn trained 600,000 Stephen Ministers. Our initial outreach to community groups will include organizations such as the Manchester Council on Aging, Action, Beverly Bootstraps, Care Dimensions, and the Chaplaincy at Beverly Hospital. For such organizations—many of whom have longstanding relationships with First Parish such as pastoral visits and cash donations—we will offer the presence of a Stephen Minister to persons served by these organizations. A Stephen Minister's objective will not be to "solve" the challenge but rather to ensure that none feel alone in their struggles. At the same time, this outreach will strengthen our relationships with these organizations to whom the Ministry may refer care receivers who need tangible services such as housing, energy assistance, or job training.

Members of the Congregation are invited and encouraged to participate in this ministry by bringing forward anyone in the community who might benefit from our care. This can include friends, neighbors, and family members whether they are affiliated with the church or not. In addition, there are many ways to participate in the Stephen Ministry depending upon your gifts and availability, including becoming a Stephen Minister after one of our future trainings. 
